Our Vocal ensembles will not only enable students to preform selected literature but will also give a general understanding of music as a performer, listener, and intelligent consumer of the fine arts. There will be some out of class assignments. The Vocal music course will require a great amount of daily attendance, class and concert participation, positive attitude, attentiveness, adherence to class expectations, proper use of social skills, and respect toward individuals and themselves.

As will all great music programs, there is a lot of preparation and support required to make this a rewarding experience for everyone involved. Philosophy

My teaching philosophy for the Vocal program is to provide a safe and encouraging space for students to grow. I want to provide the tools necessary for students to grow in musicianship, performance, and overall growth as a person. Being in choir not only helps you become a better musician, but also a better person. This program will help you with several life skills that students will take with them long after high school is over. Including: citizenship, integrity, character, respect, responsibility, dedication, time management, teamwork, focus, leadership, motivation, competition, persistence, independence, creativity, goal setting, and a sense of pride in one's school and community.

Financial Responsibilities

We will also be taking quite a few trips this year for honor choirs. It is the responsibility of the student to bring their own lunch money or lunch to eat while we are at these events if lunch is not provided.

Equipment Responsibilities

Students will be given original copies of music for practice and occasionally performances. Sets of music can be very expensive. It is the responsibility of the student to keep their music well organized and in good condition. The cost to replace lost/destroyed music will be the responsibility of the student.

Sometimes I must purchase a whole set of music, so one copy destroyed can cost you 10copies worth of Music

Travel Attire

As stated previously the choir will be taking trips to different honor choirs this year. In order to represent our school and community the best we can students will be required to bring dress clothes with them to change into for honor choir concerts. These outfits must be school appropriate. If you do not know

whether your outfits will be okay, please ask Ms. Beegle. During rehearsals students may wear leggings, shorts, or pants, with Plainview Pirate shirts.

Travel

Travel to and from school events will be done by school bus or school van. The only expectation is if the student leaves with a parent I have written documentation of this and talk to the student and parent before they leave. ONLY PARENT/GUARDIAN IS ALLOWED TO TAKE A STUDENT HOME UNLESS TALKED TO WITH MR. SHMIDT AND MS. BEEGLE.

While we are at events it is expected that the student be on their best behavior. If we are at a school event and any type of contraband is found (Example: Alcohol, Vapes, Cigarettes, ext.) parents will be contacted to immediately come pick up their child to take them home, and that student will not be allowed to participate in any out-of-town events for the rest of the school year.

Fundraiser

There are going to be a few opportunities this school year to fundraise. All fundraising money will be placed in the music account to put toward any activities or needs that the music program will be having.

Grading

The goal of our vocal program is to help students become literate, critical, and comprehensive musicians. There will be a range of activities and evaluations to help achieve this goal. The grading system will go as follows:

Musical skills 25% and Tests 25% of TOTAL grade Throughout the semester, student progress will be monitored through written and verbal tests: Some examples include:

- Memorizing Vocal Music
- Semester tests
- Sight Singing tests

Performance Attendance 30% of the TOTAL grade Students will receive full credit for attending and actively participating in a performance. These graded performances include those for any Concert Choir performance.

- If a student must miss a performance for any foreseeable reason, a note from a parent must be received to Ms. Beegle at <u>least</u> TWO WEEKS prior to the event.
- If a student has a VALID, excused absence, the concert must still be made up in the form of an additional project that is to be determined by Ms. Beegle. Grades for missed performances will be immediately recorded as a zero until made up. In case of illness, a signed note from a parent and/or doctor is required.
- Any unexcused absence WILL result in a zero for that performance. Work and homework is NEVER and excuse for missing a performance!

Rehearsal Techniques/Assignments 20% of the TOTAL <u>Grade</u>

All students receive 5 points per rehearsal in this category if expectations are met. Points will be deducted as follows at the discretion of the director:

- Tardy to class
- Absence from class
- Not being prepared for class (Music, pencil, ect.)
- Attitude

Throughout the semester we will also have homework assignments that will be assigned. There will be PLENTY of time given to students to complete the assignment.

Choir Lettering (Highschool Only)

A Total of 400 Points is required to letter

- Freshman completing entire year: 50pts
- Sophomores completing entire year: 100pts
- Juniors completing entire year: 150pts
- Seniors competing entire year: 200pts
- "A" average for the year in choir: 150pts
- "B" average for the year in choir: 100pts
- Perform National Anthem at an event: 50pts
- Audition for Honor Choirs: 20pts
- Acceptance into Honor Choirs: 50pts
- Solo or Small Ensemble Participation at DMC:
 20pts
- Receive Superior Rating at DMC: 50pts
- Solo performance in community: 10pts
- Set up for concerts: 10pts
- Perfect Performance Attendance (Concerts):
 50pts
- After school help in a Music room: 50pts
- Attend a Professional Concert: 100pts
- Attend a College Concert: 50pts
